TALKING POINT

Star Pub shooting for the stars

We understand that 1H10 adex growth is in the high teens in percentage terms from recovering consumer sentiment, vibrant property industry and the recently concluded FIFA World Cup. Star will also benefit from lower newsprint costs going forward. Its also has an enviable net cash pile. Although unspecified, a large portion of its net cash pile will be earmarked for M&As (including expanding into Sabah and Sarawak) after repaying the remaining RM100m of its MTN. With such a large reserve, we deem it possible that Star will increase its net DPR from 88% in 2009 to close to 100%. Should that occur, investors can look forward to a generous 7% net dividend yield this year. We upgrade our earnings estimates by 3% to 8% to account for 10% adex growth in FY10 or 2x real GDP growth (5% previously) and 2.5% adex growth in FY11 or 0.5x real GDP growth (5% previously). Ascribing an unchanged 15x 1-year forward PE we tweak our TP to RM4.06 (RM3.94 previously). (*refer to report for more details*)

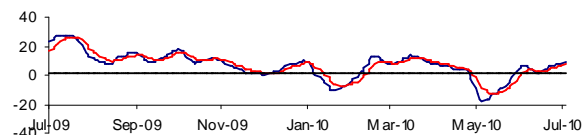

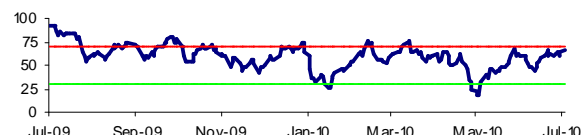

Axiata: Dialog Axiata turns to profit

Dialog Axiata Plc, a unit of Axiata (*AXIATA MK, Buy, TP: RM4.50*), turned to a second quarter profit after winning customers in previous war-torn areas of the island nation. Net income was 1.37bn rupees (US\$12.2m) in the three months ended 30 Jun, compared with a loss of 7.7bn rupees a year earlier, the unit said in a statement. Revenue rose 14% to 10.2bn rupees. Colombo-based Dialog's subscribers grew 10% to 6.6m from a year earlier, according to the statement. Axiata plans to spend RM3.6bn (US\$1.13bn) on capital expenditure this year to grow its international network, including US\$100m for its Sri Lanka arm, CFO Yusof Annuar Yaacob said 22 Jun. CIMB: To give update on Seasam's stake sale

CIMB Group Holdings Bhd (*CIMB MK, Buy, TP: RM7.63*) will update investors on its plan to sell a stake in bad-debt unit in Aug, said CEO Datuk Seri Nazir Razak. "We will do the update when we announce our second-quarter earnings in Aug," he said. News report had it that CIMB Bank Bhd was in talks with several specialist parties to sell down its stake in its "bad bank" Southeast Asia Special Asset Management Bhd (Seasam) that managed its legacy non-performing loan. Meanwhile, Nazir said the group had received approval from its shareholders to acquire 19.67% stake in PT Bank CIMB Niaga TBL for RM1.9bn from Khazanah Nasional Bhd via the issuance of new shares. Kencana: KM-1 purchase for US\$150m gets shareholders approval

Kencana Petroleum Bhd, which received shareholders approval to acquire drilling rig, KM-1, expects the cost of acquisition to be US\$150m. CEO Datuk Mokhzani Mahathir said the acquisition, to be made by Kencana Petroleum's wholly owned subsidiary Kencana Petroleum Ventures Sdn Bhd, is expected to be completed in the first week of Aug. He said the drilling rig was scheduled to be handed over to their client on 15 Aug. It is expected to be launched in Lumut, Perak on 9 Aug. (*StarBiz*)

MAHB: Inks pact on China airport jobs

Malaysia Airports Holding Bhd (MAHB) has sealed an initial pact to help provide airport operation, management and technical consultancy for the Yongzhou Lingling Airport in Hunan province and other airports in China. The group signed a memorandum of understanding with Nagamas Enterprise (HK) Ltd (NEL) to explore the possibility of providing the services. NEL's parent, Nagamas International Bhd, had previously signed an agreement with Yongzhou Municipal People's Government of Hunan province to develop Yongzhou International Air Logistic Park. The project includes the development and management of the Yongzhou Lingling Airport. (*BT*)

Mudajaya: Ready to 'cooperate fully'

Mudajaya Group Bhd said it was not aware of the nature of complaint made against the company to the Securities Commission (SC) but added that it was ready to extend its full cooperation to any query if required. The company issued a statement on the matter in response to a report saying the SC was looking into its affairs after the complaint lodged by an unidentified person. "The company has not been directly queried by the SC with regard to the complaint about the company, thus far," Mudajaya said. (*BT*)

KBB: Defaults payments on RM16m debts

KBB Resources Bhd is designated as an affected listed issuer pursuant to Practice Note 1 / 2001 (PN1) of the Main Market listing requirements of Bursa Malaysia Securities due to repayment default. In a filing to Bursa Malaysia, KBB's board of directors said the company and seven of its wholly-owned subsidiaries were in default of 18 banking facilities as they had not been able to make repayments. KBB said it had initiated a debt restructuring plan and had submitted an application to the Corporate Debt Restructuring Committee (CRDC) in respect of the restructuring scheme (*Financial Daily*)

GPRO Technologies: In reverse takeover by AB Tech worth RM140m

GPRO Technologies Bhd may be acquired under a RM140m reverse takeover by privately owned AB Technology (M) Sdn Bhd (AB Tech). Under a heads of agreement, GPRO will acquire AB Tech at an indicative purchase price of RM140m by issuing 1.4bn shares of 10 sen each. Depending on the final valuation, AB Tech may own more than 80% of GPRO shares. "Although we may lose control of GPRO, the acquisition will add value to shareholders," GPRO executive director Jordan Tang said. GPRO had been incurring losses for five years since 2005 and will require financial input and new stream of revenue in order to continue business in the long term. (*Malaysian Reserve*)

PacificMas: Halts talks with Tokio Marine

PacificMas Bhd will cease negotiation with Tokio Marine Asia Pte Ltd on the proposed disposal of the entire equity interest in its wholly owned subsidiary, The Pacific Insurance Bhd. According to a Bursa Malaysia filing, PacificMas said it had informed Tokio Marine of its intention to discontinue with negotiations. No reasons were given on the matter. The company had earlier announced that it had received a letter from Bank Negara Malaysia dated 9 Jun, 2010 stating that the central bank had no objection in principle for it to start preliminary negotiations with Tokio Marine on the disposal of its insurance business. Leong Hup: Plans RM30m broiler farm

Integrated poultry company Leong Hup Holdings Bhd plans to spend up to RM30m this year to set up a broiler farm in the Bio Desaru Food Valley project in the Kota Tinggi district. Executive director Tan Sri Francis Lau Tuan Nguang said the farm would be located on 72.48ha dedicated for poultry farming activities within the 3,642.17ha Bio Desaru Food Valley, the first big scale organic food farm in the country. "We are investing between RM20m and RM30m in the farm which will have the capacity to produce 500,000 to over 1m fowls within the next three years," he said. (*StarBiz*)

Economy: Q1 FDI nearly matches 2009's

The International Trade and Industry Ministry said foreign direct investment (FDI) for the first quarter nearly matched that of the entire 2009. FDI inflows totalled RM5.06bn in the first quarter, versus RM5.66bn for all of 2009, said Minister Datuk Seri Mustapa Mohamed in a statement. "But this is not enough. According to the PM, we still have to continue with reforms to attract investors and achieve the goals of the 10th Malaysia Plan and Vision 2020". (*StarBiz*)

US: Stocks rally on housing, FedEx

Stocks rallied Monday after FedEx's improved forecast and a better-than-expected housing market report tempered worries about the economic outlook. The Dow Jones industrial average gained 1.0% (+100.8 pts, close 10,525.4). The Nasdaq gained 1.2% (+27.0 pts, close 2,296.4) and the S&P 500 gained 1.1% (+12.4 pts, close 1,115.0). U.S. light crude oil for Sep delivery fell 6 cents to US\$78.92 a barrel on the New York Mercantile Exchange. (*CNNmoney*)

US: June new homes sales climb more than forecast

Sales of U.S. new homes rose in Jun more than forecast following an unprecedented collapse the prior month, a signal the worst of the slump triggered by the end of a government tax credit is over. Purchases increased 24% from May to an annual pace of 330,000, figures from the Commerce Department showed in Washington. The rate was the second-lowest in data going back to 1963 after May's downwardly revised 267,000 pace. The lowest mortgage rates on record may help underpin demand, stabilizing the industry that triggered the worst recession since the 1930s. Even so, increasing foreclosures are swelling the number of unsold existing homes, putting pressure on prices and keeping buyers on the sidelines as unemployment hovers near 10% and the economy cools. UK: Housing at 'turning point' as price drop

U.K. house prices fell in July for the first time in 15 months as the government's budget squeeze curbed demand and more people tried to sell their properties, Hometrack Ltd. said. The average price in England and Wales fell 0.1% from June to 158,700 pounds (US\$244,985), the London-based property researcher said in an e-mailed report, citing a survey of surveyors and real-estate agents. Home values in the capital led the decline, dropping 0.2%. On the year, prices rose 2%. "The fall in prices marks a turning point for the housing market," Richard Donnell, director of research at Hometrack, said in the report. "Further modest price falls are inevitable over the second half of the year as the volume of homes for sale continues to rise and demand remains weak on the back of concerns over the wider economic outlook and uncertainty over the impact of recently announced cuts in government spending." China: Yuan peg caused excess liquidity

A "fixed" yuan exchange rate caused excess capital in China's financial system that may stoke inflation, making it difficult to manage the economy, central bank Deputy Governor Hu Xiaolian said. China pegged the yuan at around 6.83 per dollar for two years before abandoning the regime on June 19 and has allowed the currency to appreciate 0.7% since then. The policy swelled foreign-exchange reserves to a record US\$2.45trn in Jun, the world's largest, as the central bank mopped up dollars and flooded the market with yuan. "With China's rapid economic growth, foreign-exchange inflows have accelerated, and increases in financial liquidity create potential risks of heightened inflation expectations and speculation in assets," Hu wrote in a statement on the People's Bank of China's website. The independence and effectiveness of China's monetary policy has been "severely challenged." (*Bloomberg*)

Japan: Exports rise faster than economists expected

Japan's exports rose faster than economists estimated, sustaining a boost to the recovery that may diminish as global growth cools and the yen strengthens. Shipments abroad advanced 27.7% in June from a year earlier, the Finance Ministry said in Tokyo. The median estimate of 19 economists surveyed by Bloomberg News was for 23.5%. From a month earlier, exports fell 1.8%. While exports have climbed for seven straight months, June's gain was the weakest this year as demand from China and Europe waned. The yen reached a seven-month high against the dollar this month, prompting officials including Trade Minister Masayuki Naoshima to warn that its rise may hurt the economy. Imports advanced 26.1% in June from a year earlier, leaving a trade surplus of 687bn yen (US\$7.8bn), and 41.1% higher than the same month in 2009. (*Bloomberg*)

India: Needs monetary steps to cool inflation, Central Bank says

India needs tighter monetary policy to cool inflation, the central bank said, signalling the possibility of an interest-rate increase. "For containing the inflation persistence and anchoring inflation expectations, anti-inflationary monetary policy actions become a necessity," the Reserve Bank of India said in a report before Governor Devoir Subaru's rate decision at 11:30 a.m. in Mumbai. India's key wholesale-price inflation rate has stayed above 10% since Feb and the opposition plans to attack Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's government in parliament over the issue. Prices may rise further after Singh on June 25 allowed state-run refiners, including Indian Oil Corp., to raise fuel costs. (*Bloomberg*)

Global

Singapore: Factory output rises at slowest pace in four months

Singapore's industrial production rose at the slowest pace in four months in June as pharmaceutical and electronic manufacturers made fewer goods, suggesting demand may ease as the global recovery cools. Output at factories, which accounts for about a quarter of the economy, climbed 26.1% in Jun from a year earlier, after a revised 58.4% surge in May, the Economic Development Board said in a statement. The median estimate of 10 economists surveyed by Bloomberg News was for a 38.4% gain. Production in the second quarter rose 44.5%, less than the government's preliminary estimate earlier this month of 45.5%. Singapore's economy accelerated to an unprecedented 18.1% pace in the first half, prompting the government to raise its GDP forecast for the third time this year to as much as 15%. (*Bloomberg*)
